

Rank	WTCA Management Committee Activities Ranking (18 total participants -- 5 suppliers, 8 regular OQM meeting attendees)
1	ORisk — Release Phase I of the online presentations which will include Risk 101, Insurance 101, Bidding and Terms and Conditions of Sale, Successful Negotiation Recommendations and Understanding Indemnification and Insurance Requirement Provisions. Continue to progress through all 4 specialties, releasing in groups of modules.
2	Plant Training for New Employees — Develop baseline training for new plant employees, directed specifically to new employees in the assembly area.
3	Operation Safety — Support the current Operation Safety program, including the release of the new Forklift Certification program. Add to the Operation Safety program a Truss Driver Certification program.
4	Fall Protection — Participate with the Occupational Safety & Health Administration (OSHA) and the National Association of Home Builders (NAHB) on fall protection guidelines for structures using structural building components.
5	Sawdust Collection — Work with TPI and saw manufacturers to pursue testing on quantifying and minimizing sawdust production, as well as work with members to identify industry best practices on sawdust collection.
6	Insurance Strategy — Create materials that draw CMs and approved brokers together and provide continued information to Brokers that help them maintain activity and growth in our industry.
7	WFD — Work toward posting 1,000 resumes. Leverage new relationships with technical schools, community colleges and high schools and Workforce Centers to find students and other qualified individuals interested in entering the industry. Develop a strategy for creating an engine that continually supplies good resumes for our membership to review and select potential employees from. Evaluate the effectiveness of this and report on/make recommendations to the management committee on this approach for future years.
8	Truck Driver Training — Create a Certified Truss Industry Truck Driver program. This would be an online training and certification program.
9	FPS — Group Data Results of Survey into Geographic Regions.
10	WTCA Guides — Create guides addressing natural disasters, hearing loss and off-loading trusses.
11	Wage/FPS — Promote greater use of the Wage and Benefit Survey and Financial Performance Survey. Surveys can be submitted online or on paper.
12	Lumber Trading Data Program — Implement the database program on the prices component manufacturers are paying for lumber. The goal is to provide members with lumber pricing and lumber purchase volume information in real time so that better lumber purchasing decisions can be made. The program is in beta site development. Develop an implementation plan and evaluate the effectiveness of this and report on/make recommendations to the management committee.

13	Lumber Industry Symposium — Create a symposium whose goal is to get lumber mill decisions makers talking with component manufacturer decision makers. Implement this symposium concept in 2006. Evaluate the effectiveness of this and report on/make recommendations to the management committee on this approach for future years.
14	WFD — Develop a strategy to engage technical schools and other educational institutions in supplying talent to our industry. Work with them on integrating Truss Technical information and Truss Technician Training into a process that would help students increase their value to our industry while fitting within the programs that the technical school is offering. Figure out a streamlined way to get resumes into our WFD system. Evaluate the effectiveness of this and report on/make recommendations to the management committee on this approach for future years.
15	OSHA Alliance — Finalize the Alliance agreement with OSHA, and begin promotion of our industry's safety initiatives through the Alliance program.
16	Rail Industry — Monitor rail issues facing component manufacturers and explore further strategies to address those issues. Work with our membership to provide solutions. Evaluate the effectiveness of this and report on/make recommendations to the management committee on this approach for future years.
17	NLBMDA — Work with NLBMDA on coordinating mutually beneficial priorities and converting the WTCA Operation Safety to their specifications.
18	Grants — Prepare and apply for Federal and/or State grants to assist WTCA in developing additional education programs and conducting research and/or testing. (for example, the Susan Harwood Grant through OSHA).
19	WTCA Transportation Guide — Convert Transportation Guide into online modules as part of the ORisk and Safety Programs.
20	Crane Education — Convert all TTB and B-Series Crane information into an online training program (much like the TTT program).
21	Truss Crane Operator — Create a Certified Truss Crane Operator program. This would be an online training and certification program.
